



Updated COVID Guidelines - Temple Beth Torah Updated February 18, 2022

- General Guidelines:
 - All members and visitors to TBT (over 5 years old) must be up to date with their COVID vaccinations (or have pre-approved medical exemption).
 - All attendees and visitors (over 2yrs) must wear masks.
 - Except while eating or drinking
 - At each service, a list of people who have already submitted proof of vaccination to the office will be available to the committee member checking in attendees.
 - Anyone not on the list is required to show their vaccination card (or California or other accepted government online registration).
 - A clearly visible sign will be posted indicating proof of vaccination requirements.
 - To be added to the list, email a photo copy of your vaccination card to the temple office (please let us know if you need help with this).
 - Upon arrival, please sign in at the registration table.
 - Families with unvaccinated children under 5 years old in attendance, please socially distance.
 - There will be a section for any families with unvaccinated children or persons with valid medical exemptions present.
 - Meetings/Services continue to have a Zoom/Stream option, to be set up by meeting/service organizer.
 - Doors may remain closed with the exception of the primary double doors to the breezeway.
- Service Guidelines
 - Service leader may be unmasked while leading the service at least 6 feet from attendees (single speaker only).
 - Please bring your own Kippah and tallit (if desired).
 - Sanctuary will be set up with extra spacing between rows. Congregants can seat themselves as desired.
 - Wine /juice and challah may be set out in the social hall for after services. These items may be consumed either indoors or out, in compliance with above masking guidelines.

- Meetings/Events Guidelines

- All meetings and events of 5 or more people will be held in the social hall (and/or sanctuary), with doors open, or outdoors.
- Meetings with $< \text{ or } = 10$ attendees may unanimously agree to have masks optional (those who want to keep them on are more than welcome to).
