



### TBT COVID Guidelines Have Been Updated

Throughout the pandemic, the health, safety, and well-being of each member of our community has been the central focus of all COVID policy decisions.

We continue to center these values; however, we acknowledge that we are in a different stage of the pandemic. Now that the COVID vaccine is available to people above 6 months old and the COVID levels are low in our county, we have chosen to update our COVID guidelines to reflect this new stage.

*The biggest change of note:* As long as Alameda County remains in the lowest level of transmission, our programming and services - indoor and outdoor - will be masks optional (but encouraged).

Temple Beth Torah reserves the right to require masking as transmission levels change, for specific events, or in specific sections of program space.

#### COVID Guidelines - Temple Beth Torah

- If you are experiencing any symptoms of COVID or have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID in the past two weeks, please stay home.
- All members and visitors to TBT (over 6 months old) must be up to date with their COVID vaccinations and boosters.
- Masks are optional for all events and services, but we encourage wearing masks indoors.
  - We will monitor the case rates in the county and will reinstate mask requirements whenever Alameda County enters the yellow tier.
  - For services, we will have a designated section in the room where masks will be required.
  - We may, on occasion, choose to make masks required for a specific event or service regardless of the tier.
